Resources


- Keighley Local Studies Library has a number of collections related to WW1 and WW2, including samples of ration books, identity papers, postcards, propaganda, government pamphlets and recruitment posters. The largest collection is for WW1. See list of WW resources.
- Brigg, BK10 WW1 collections show the war effort to help soldiers at war, Red Cross and hospital activity, recruitment in the town. Please check the catalogue for full topics covered.
- BMT/KE 10: WW1, WW2 miscellaneous collections of a variety of documents and records from the domestic front.
- Thesis on war savings, domestic fund raising and War Weapons' Week.
- Individual soldiers' war experiences in the archive collections, newspaper cuttings and obituaries, Keighley Boys' Grammar school journal. Also Rolls of Service and Honour, Enlistments, access to Ancestry online military records.
- Histories of battalions and BK34 West Riding Regiment 6th battalion photo album.
- Histories of war hospitals, including photos of staff and soldier patients. Morton War Hospital collection: patient register, history, patient newsletter, photos and history of the wards and medical work. BK 29, 39, Also study of transportation of wounded to hospital.
